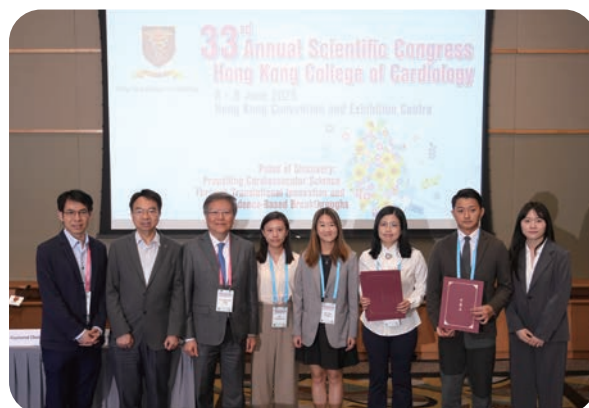

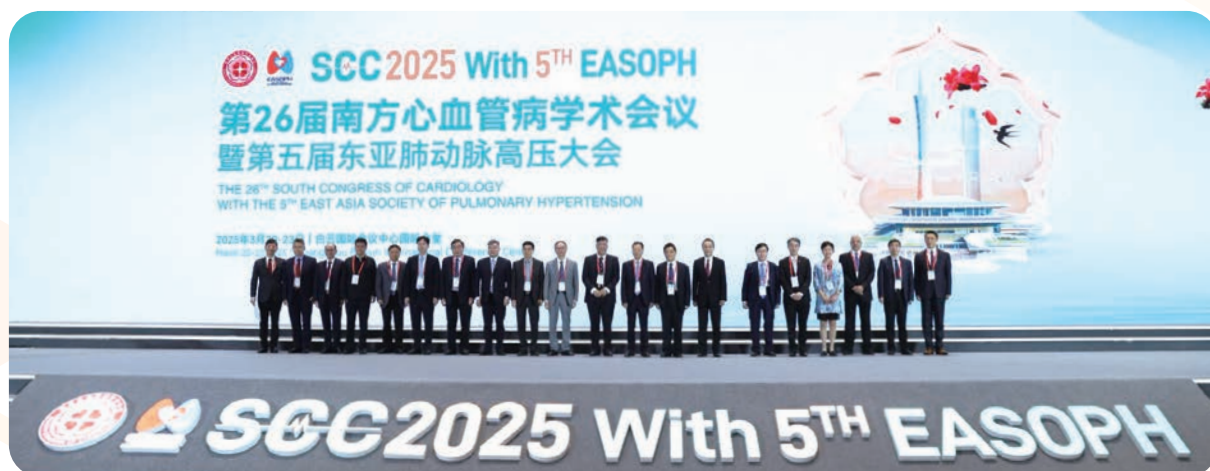








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President's Message



It is with great pride that I reflect on the remarkable achievements of our College over the past year in advancing professional education and promoting heart health—milestones made possible through the unwavering dedication of our Council Members.

Our commitment to international collaboration continues to flourish, as evidenced by our successful partnerships with leading cardiac societies worldwide. We were honoured to be invited to hold joint sessions at the American College of Cardiology, European Society of Cardiology, Asia Pacific Society of Cardiology, EuroPCR, and AICT AsiaPCR. Additionally, we continue to strengthen ties with colleagues in mainland China through our support of the South Congress of Cardiology in Guangzhou, Cardiovascular Frontiers - Futian Forum, and Cardiovascular Interventional Summit in Shenzhen. In a landmark achievement, we are delighted to announce that our College has successfully won the bid to host the APSC in 2029 - a testament to the international community's confidence in Hong Kong's medical excellence and our College's organisational capabilities.

This year marked another milestone in our College's academic endeavors, with a series of highly successful scientific meetings advancing cardiovascular education. The 10th Asian Preventive Cardiology & Cardiac Rehabilitation Conference (APCCRP) celebrated the 30th Anniversary of Cardiac Rehabilitation in Hong Kong, commemorated with a specially designed faculty souvenir - a 3D-printed heart model. Our Annual Scientific Congress (ASC) has solidified its position as Hong Kong's premier cardiovascular education event. The 33rd ASC featured a comprehensive scientific program, including a series of highly successful workshops and joint sessions with esteemed international cardiac societies, which provided valuable learning opportunities for cardiologists, trainees, primary care physicians, allied health professionals, and medical students.

We have also expanded our scientific events and subspecialty Chapters to meet growing demands and stay at the forefront of cardiology advancements. The 6th Hong Kong Complex Cardiovascular Intervention (HKCCI), organised by the Cardiovascular Intervention Chapter, attracted nearly 200 faculty members and participants from 21 countries and regions. The Sports and Exercise Cardiology Chapter contributed to the release of the joint HKCC/HKASMSS Position Statements on Pre-Participation Evaluation for Distance Runners. As it approaches its 17th

Anniversary, the Paediatric Cardiology Chapter continues to promote the advancement of knowledge and science in paediatric cardiology for specialists and trainees. Our commitment to nurturing the next generation of cardiologists remains strong, as reflected in the well-received Hong Kong Core Cardiology Certificate Course and Intervention Fellow Course, and scholarships for advanced cardiovascular training.

Heart health advocacy remains central to our mission. This year, we achieved significant milestones in public engagement. Our World Heart Day Carnival cum Run for Heart 2024–25 drew over 1,100 participants, with the newly introduced Hospital Cup receiving overwhelming enthusiasm. The Jump Rope for Heart Program continues to promote heart health among students. We are also proud to continue our partnership with the Department of Health on initiatives such as “Joyful Fruit Month” of the “EatSmart @School.hk Campaign”, and support the Rotary Club’s CPR/AED Education Project. Through press conferences on Exercise & Heart Health, Obesity & Heart Disease, and Hypertension, we delivered important health messages to the public. Additionally, our Heart Health Channel remains a trusted platform, providing evidence-based cardiovascular information to the community.

These accomplishments would not have been possible without the unwavering support of our office bearers Dr. TSUI Kin Lam, Dr. CHAN Kwok Keung, and Dr. CHAN Wing Sze, Carmen, all Council Members, and Honorary Advisers. I express my sincere gratitude to all involved.

Report Summary



Since its foundation in 1992, the Hong Kong College of Cardiology (the College) has been continuing its mission to promote the advancement of cardiovascular medicine and public health through scientific, professional, and educational activities, as well as international collaboration. Its ultimate goal is to promote the heart health of Hong Kong and uphold the highest standards of competence and ethical integrity in cardiovascular practice.

The 10th Asian Preventive Cardiology and Cardiac Rehabilitation Conference (APCCRC) was held from 22-24 November 2024 under the theme of “The Magic of Prevention and Rehabilitation - Can we Avoid a Cardiovascular Event?” This biennial meeting provided an excellent opportunity for sharing expertise on a wide range of topics in preventive cardiology and cardiac rehabilitation, attracting both local and international doctors and allied health professionals. This year, APCCRC was held in conjunction with 27th Annual Scientific Meeting of Institute of Cardiovascular Science and Medicine, enriching the program and reinforcing our collaborative ties with other societies. The College also continued to co-organize the Hong Kong Core Cardiology Certificate Course with the Hong Kong Public Hospital Cardiologists Association. Second Cycle Module 6 to Module 8 were held on 15 September 2024, 26 January 2025 and 13 April 2025 respectively.

The 33rd Annual Scientific Congress of the College took place from 6-8 June 2025, drawing over 960 registrations. Many renowned international experts in cardiovascular medicine contributed to this highly educational program. Strong international collaboration was one of the hallmarks, as exemplified by joint sessions with the American College of Cardiology, Asian Pacific Society of Cardiology, British Cardio-Oncology Society, European Society of Cardiology and Korean Society of Cardiology.

To further its core missions, the Scientific Committee and Public Health Education Committee continued to promote professional and public health education on heart diseases. Both committees were supported by many enthusiastic young College fellows. Throughout the year, the College and its various chapters also organized a range of well-received local scientific programs.



Report Summary

The College has remained active in organizing community initiatives to promote cardiovascular health. The Jump Rope for Heart Program actively engaged schoolchildren in heart health promotion through rope skipping. Other notable event included the World Heart Day Carnival cum Run for Heart 2024-25, held on 5 January 2025 at The Hong Kong Science and Technology Park, which served as a major annual highlight in public heart health advocacy.

In terms of professional development, the College supported cardiology trainees and fellows in pursuing advanced training at world-renowned overseas centres through the Hong Kong Heart Foundation Cardiology Training Fellowship Programme and Dr. C O PUN and Dr. Mary B L KWONG Scholarship.

The diverse and impactful activities would not be possible without the dedication and active participation of our members, the support of friends and sponsors, and the contributions of leading practitioners and academics both locally and internationally. The Council would like to take this opportunity to express heartfelt gratitude to all our members and supporters. The College pledges to continue her mission with clarity and determination in the years ahead.

The 10th Asian Preventive Cardiology & Cardiac Rehabilitation Conference (APCCRC) was successfully held on 22-24 November 2024 at the Hong Kong Convention and Exhibition Centre.

The theme of this year was **“The magic of prevention and rehabilitation - Can we avoid a cardiovascular event?”**, featuring a comprehensive programme in preventive cardiology and cardiac rehabilitation. Joint sessions with Asian Federation of Sports Medicine, China Cardiovascular Association, Japanese Association of Cardiac Rehabilitation, and Singapore Heart Foundation were held during the Conference for sharing of experience in preventive cardiology and cardiac rehabilitation among experts from different countries. Special forums “China and Hong Kong Innovative Forum in Cardiovascular Disease Management”, “District Health Centre and Express Forum”, and public forum were organized this year.

Background

One of the most important missions of Hong Kong College of Cardiology (HKCC) is to promote the training and standard of our cardiology professionals so as to translate into better clinical patient care.

In view of the vast and tremendous explosions in knowledge with ever increasing new advances, it is becoming increasingly difficult for cardiologists and fellow trainees to stay abreast and keep up to date on core knowledge as well as new frontier technology.

However, the prerequisite of top-quality patient care depends highly on core clinical knowledge and experience. Therefore, HKCC determines to launch this first-of-its-kind certificate training course in 2018 and starts the 2nd cycle in 2023. We are pleased to have Hong Kong Public Hospital Cardiologists Association (HKPHCA), which shares similar aims, to co-organize the course.

Goal

The goal of the course is for our cardiology professionals to enhance their core cardiology knowledge and skill in day-to-day clinical practice.

Course Description

The Course consists of 9 modules, each of one-day duration, over the period of 3 years. It provides a comprehensive broad base and up-to-date review of clinical diseases and the management. Topics included general cardiology, coronary artery disease, arrhythmia, valvular & pericardial disease, heart failure & cardiomyopathy, congenital heart disease, hypertension, perioperative consult, clinical electrophysiology, core echocardiographic & interventional knowhow & tips, critical cardiac care, and pearls of wisdom from the experts. Approach to common symptoms,

intelligent use of investigations and tips & tricks in intervention & device usage will be highlighted. The course also serves as good review for trainees to prepare for cardiology examinations.

Target Participants

All cardiologists in clinical practice and fellow trainees will benefit from the course. Due to limited capacity and to allow more interaction, fellows in training who are also members of HKCC / HKPHCA have priority for enrollment.

Certification

A short examination will be held at the end of each module. Delegates passing the examination will get a certificate of that module. Upon completion and passing examination of at least 6 out of 9 modules, delegate will get a certificate for the Course.

Progress

All modules were very well received with most delegates stayed through the whole day program and provided excellent feedback. Due to overwhelming responses for participation, the capacity for most modules had to be expanded to around 80 or more to accommodate for request from enthusiastic members.

HKCCCCII Module 6: Hypertension, Preoperative Consult, Cardiac Rehabilitation, Miscellaneous Diseases & Heart

The 6th module was successfully held with 56 cardiologists, anesthesiologist, surgeons, general practitioner and cardiology trainees participated. A total of 34 attendees took the examination with passing rate 100%. Online evaluation forms were distributed after the course and we received 13 responses. Most of them strongly agreed the course was clearly and logically organized and the duration of the course was appropriate. Overall, all the interviewees were very satisfied with the course with a high rating of 4.54 on a scale of 5.

The 7th module was successfully held and well-received with 76 cardiologists, anesthesiologist, trainees in different specialties and nurses attended. 38 attendees took the examination and the passing rate was 100%. Online evaluation forms were distributed after the course and 15 forms were received. Most of them strongly agreed the course met their training needs, was practical for use in their workplace and enhanced participants' learning in the course. Overall, all the interviewees were very satisfied with the course with a high rating of 4.53 on a scale of 5.

HKCCCCII Module 8: Clinical Electrophysiology & Core Cath Lab Knowledge

The 8th module was successfully held drawing 76 cardiologists, anesthesiologist, surgeon, general practitioner and trainees to participate in the course. 38 attendees took the examination with 100% passing rate. 18 participants completed online evaluation forms and most of them strongly agreed the course achieved its stated objectives, organized clearly and logically and enhanced participants' learning. Overall, all the interviewees were very satisfied with the course with a high rating of 4.67 on a scale of 5.

Jump Rope for Heart Program (JRFH) (跳繩強心) 2024-2025

In this academic year (2024-2025), 52 schools (40 primary schools and 10 secondary schools, 1 international school and 1 kindergarten) have joined Jump Rope for Heart Program. Over 1,260,000 students from 670 schools have joined the program over the past twenty-six years.

School visits by the expert team were conducted in 10 schools in this academic year. Many students were amazed by the wonderful performance of the elite skippers and showed great interest in learning rope skipping. Besides, 2 anti-drug exhibitions, co-organized by JRFH and Auxiliary Medical Service, were conducted at JRFH schools, which were well received with very positive feedback.

JRFH Inter-school Rope Skipping Competition 2025 will be held on 12 July 2025 (Sat) at Southorn Stadium (灣仔修頓室內運動場). A total of 35 primary schools were divided into Group A / Group B / Group C1 & C2 whereas 19 secondary schools were divided into Group A / Group B. Representatives from HKCC, Department of Health, Education Bureau, Leisure and Cultural Services Department, and Hong Kong Rope Skipping Association, China were invited to be the honorary judges. Dr. CHAN Kwok Keung and Dr. CHAN Wing Sze, Carmen will attend the event on behalf of HKCC.

The Rotary Club CPR & AED Education Project 2024/2025 was jointly organized by HKCC, Rotary Club of Hong Kong Northeast and St. John Ambulance Association for the 9th year. Dr. LEUNG Tat Chi, Godwin attended the opening ceremony on behalf of HKCC on 30 November 2024 at St. John Headquarters. Similar to the previous year, JRFH secretariat assisted in recruiting 100 teachers to participate in a one-day CRP & AED certificate course at St. John Headquarters free of charge. A total of 50 teachers attended the one-day CPR & AED certificate courses on 15 September 2024 and 28 December 2024.

The Joyful Fruit Month – School Fruit Promotion Project is jointly organized by HKCC and the Department of Health. A maximum of HK\$2,000 per school is granted to a maximum of 75 schools per year. As of 20 June 2025, 65 schools have claimed HK\$110,726.71 for Joyful Fruit Month 2025.

The Hong Kong Delegation participated in the AJRU Championships 2024 in Kawasaki, Japan from 23 to 30 July 2024. The Hong Kong Delegation was able to claim 26 gold, 34 silver and 58 bronze medals (total 118 medals). HKCC provided a total sponsorship of HK\$200,000. Finally, HKCC received 198 sponsorship applications from participating athletes, with a sponsorship amount of HK\$1,000 per athlete. The celebration dinner was held at New World Millennium Hong Kong Hotel on 13 September 2024 (Friday).

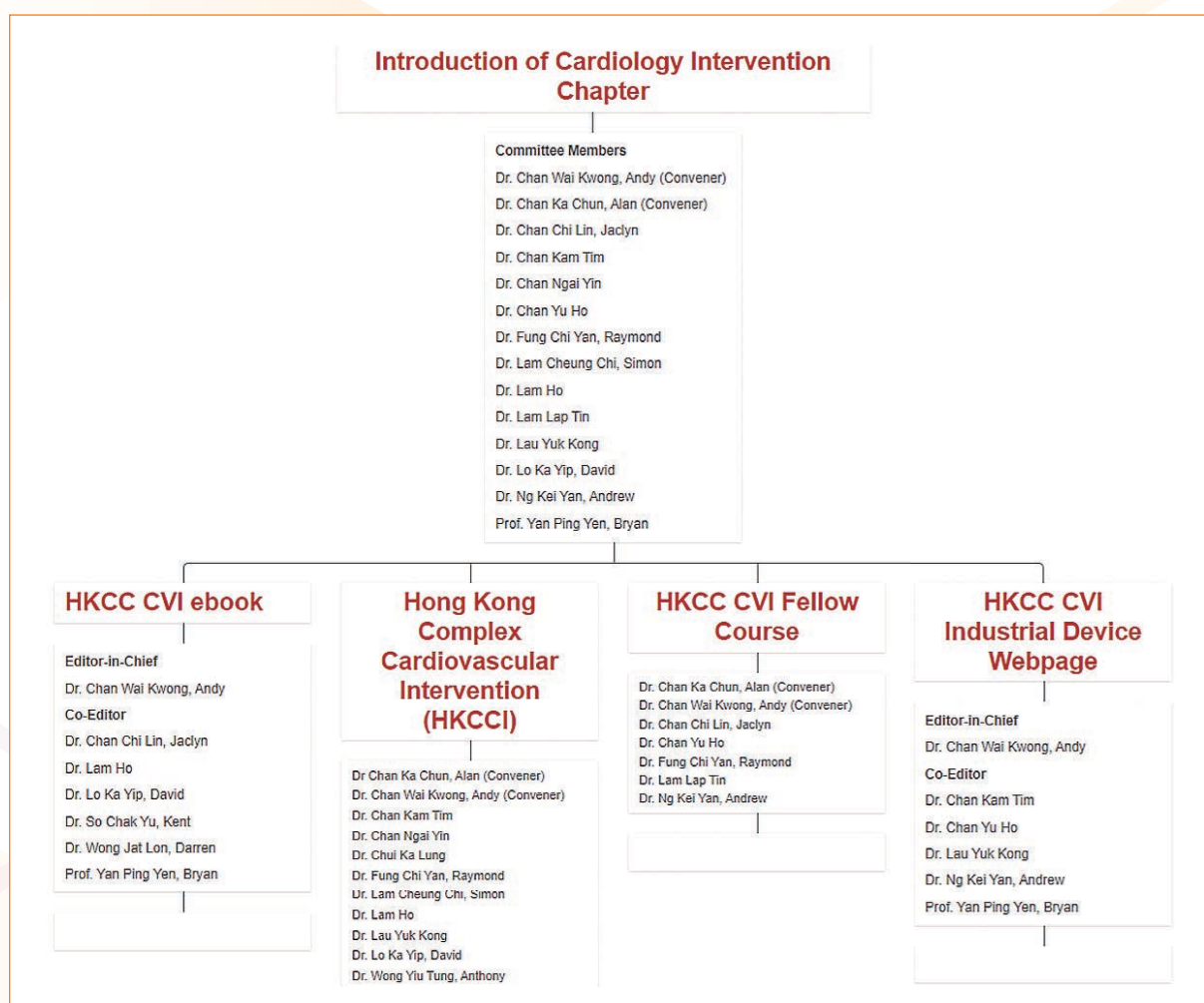

Last year, the chapter published a joint position statement with the Sports Medicine and Sports Science Association of Hong Kong, China (HKASMSS) on Pre-Participation Evaluation for Distance Runners.

The joint HKCC/HKASMSS Position Statements on Pre-Participation Evaluation for Distance Runners (2024):

1. Regular running is good for cardiovascular and overall health
2. Competitive distance running, like marathon, demands the participant to have proper training, and a high degree of cardiovascular fitness.
3. All runners at potential risk* should consider to consult their physicians to assess their medical fitness before participating in distance running.

Indicators of potential risk:

- family history of cardiovascular disease or unexplained death,
- exercise related symptoms (chest pain, tightness or discomfort; dizziness; loss of consciousness, excessive shortness of breath, palpitations or excessive fatigue etc),

- high coronary artery disease risk (women age 55 or older, men aged 45 or older, smokers, hypertension, diabetes mellitus and dyslipidemia etc)
- 4. Pre-participation evaluation aiming to detect underlying cardiovascular diseases may help to prevent exercise-related adverse cardiac events.
- 5. Runners are reminded to stop and rest, and seek medical care if they have symptoms during exercise such as chest pain, palpitation, dizziness, or excessive shortness of breath. These symptoms may present after exercise in the first hour or longer.

香港心臟專科學院 (HKCC) 與 香港運動醫學及科學學會 (HKASMSS) 聯合聲明：長跑運動前參賽者評估 (2024)

1. 定期跑步有助於心血管和整體健康。
2. 參加競技長跑，例如馬拉松，要求參賽者具有適當的訓練和高度的心血管健康。
3. 所有具潛在風險*的跑步者應考慮在參加長跑運動前諮詢醫生，評估其體能是否適合參加比賽。
 - ★潛在風險指標包括：
 - 心血管疾病史或不明原因死亡的家族病史；
 - 運動期間的相關症狀(如胸痛、胸悶或不適；頭暈；失去意識；過度氣喘；心悸或過度疲勞等)；
 - 冠狀動脈疾病相關的高風險因素(如女性年齡 55 歲或以上，男性年齡45 歲或以上，吸煙，高血壓，糖尿病和血脂水平異常等)。
4. 參賽前的評估旨在檢測潛在的心血管疾病，可能有助於預防運動相關的心臟不良事件。
5. 跑步者應注意在運動過程中，如出現胸痛、心悸、頭暈或過度氣喘等症狀，應立即停止運動並尋求醫療協助。這些症狀可能在運動後的首小時或更長時間內出現。

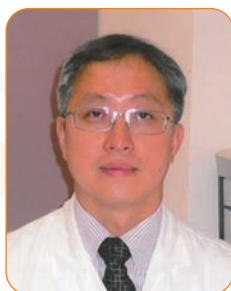
